The standout feature of the project is its striking golden aluminum mesh envelope, which envelops both the interior spaces and the expansive outdoor terrace. Acting as a visually arresting sunshade, this intricate lattice not only filters the intense California rays but also frames the breathtaking 180-degree panoramas that stretch from downtown LA to the Hollywood hills.

Selgascano and Cano's design celebrates the fluidity between interior and exterior realms, creating a harmonious dialogue between the built environment and nature. The envelope's open structure invites verdant growth, with plans for various creepers, bushes, and ten different palm tree varieties to eventually colonize the vibrant canary-yellow cage, blurring the boundaries between architecture and landscape.

Driven by a desire for affordability without compromising craftsmanship, the architects meticulously prefabricated and shipped the house's components, enabling efficient on-site assembly. This approach yielded a bespoke, handcrafted quality while maintaining cost-effectiveness – a remarkable achievement in a city renowned for its high construction expenses.
