Project - Nestled in the mountainous region of Anaikatti, India, The Infinite Rise House by Earthscape Studio artfully embraces its natural setting. Utilizing locally-sourced materials, the home's gabion stone facade mimics the rocky outcrops while framing serene views. Inside, it cultivates a connection to nature through an open floorplan centered around a light-filled courtyard. The 1800 sq ft residence optimizes cross ventilation and passive solar design. Its thermal mass oxide flooring, water features, and greenery help maintain comfortable temperatures, while steel-framed windows usher in light and scenery. Scrap wood lends warmth to custom furniture and cabinetry. Though contemporary in materials and form, the home feels intrinsically linked to its surroundings through its response to the land. The Infinite Rise House's sensitivity to site provides a sustainable model of modern living in harmony with the environment.

Design Team - Pursuing his architectural journey at Wallmakers since 2020, Petchimuthu Kennedy, lead architect of Earthscape Studio, draws inspiration from mentor Vinu Daniel's creative techniques.
