Project - Powerhouse Company's Marga Klompé Building sets a new benchmark for

sustainable university architecture in Europe. This nearly energy-neutral complex at Tilburg

University in the Netherlands is the first college building constructed entirely from solid

wood.

The project's circular ambitions are embodied through its innovative use of renewable

materials like wood, terrazzo and plasterwork throughout. A unique dry construction system

utilizing wooden ribbed floors allows large free spans while meeting stringent acoustic

requirements for the lecture halls and auditorium spaces.

The exterior form pays homage to the campus' iconic 1962 Cobbenhagen Building with its

cubic massing clad in Portuguese natural stone facades with deep reveals. But the building

transcends mere imitation through thoughtful sustainable strategies like integrated

photovoltaics, efficient climate systems, and insulation partly made from recycled denim

jeans.

Indoors, the material palette cultivates a serene atmosphere for the 1,000 students the

building serves. Exposed wood beams work in concert with warm terrazzo flooring and

furniture to create tranquil study areas flooded with natural light.

With its BREEAM Outstanding certification, the Marga Klompé Building represents a holistic

vision for the future of education facilities. Its name honors the first female Dutch minister

who championed social equity - values this environmentally-progressive project admirably

upholds.
