

探访指数 - 伊波朗加住宅

总分：4.0/5.0 (大西洋森林边缘的冲浪者栖居地)

1. 森林与现代主义的隐匿重塑：这是一处位于巴西瓜鲁雅的私人海滩住宅，建筑面积达 750 平方米。作为一处私享的家庭度假屋，其内部谢绝公众造访。圣保罗本土设计团队对这座既有的现代主义建筑进行了一场克制而敏锐的改造。他们没有强加全新的建筑符号，而是通过梳理原有的空间轴线、锐化建筑轮廓，并在外立面增设了宽大的防护雨篷，让这栋住宅以前所未有的谦逊姿态隐入受保护的大西洋沿岸森林之中。

2. 以居住者生活方式为导向的底层重组：这座住宅最打动人心的特质，在于其空间规划完全服从于居住者的真实生活节律。由于业主是一个狂热的水翼冲浪家庭，建筑师将底层空间彻底重构为一个被戏称为“帆板洞穴”的专属区域。这里不仅妥善收纳了各种冲浪板、潜水服和专业设备，还无缝植入了家庭影院、办公区与游戏室。这种拒绝矫揉造作、将建筑视为直接服务于生活的基础设施的设计态度，展现了极高的空间实用美学。

3. 模糊内外边界的自然质感：步入二层的起居空间，一种轻盈而具有航海气息的氛围扑面而来。浅色木材、天然石材与石灰华材质交织在一起，为室内奠定了温润的基调。建筑师在餐厅的边柜上方巧妙地安置了一面镜子，将室外葱郁的森林景观直接倒映入室内，彻底消解了建筑的物理边界。通过这些克制而精准的材质与光影调

度，这座住宅实现了与其所处自然环境的深层共鸣。

探访建议

- **推荐方式:** 将视觉焦点投向底层那个兼具粗犷与精密的“帆板洞穴”，以及二层起居室中那些倒映着大西洋森林绿意的巧妙镜面设计，体察建筑师如何将狂热的户外生活方式优雅地转译为室内空间语汇。
- **核心看点:** 研读设计团队的空间克制美学。观察他们是如何摒弃张扬的自我表达，将“积极倾听”作为核心设计工具，从而让翻新后的旧建筑如同一件量身定制的贴身衣物般，完美契合居住者的生活轨迹与精神诉求的。
- **场域周边推荐:** 既然你已将目光投向了巴西的圣保罗州沿海地区，极力建议你在未来亲临瓜鲁雅时，不仅要享受这片著名的海滩胜地，更要驱车前往圣保罗市区。你可以去探访由巴西现代主义建筑大师丽娜·博·巴尔迪设计的圣保罗艺术博物馆，在宏大的城市尺度中，感受巴西当代建筑那份悬挑于空中的原始力量与自由精神。

一句话总结: 它以克制的设计语言与温润的天然材质，在巴西瓜鲁雅的森林边缘，将一座旧海滩别墅精准重塑为服务于冲浪家族的静谧庇护所。

1. Hidden Reshaping of Forest and Modernism: Located in Guarujá, Brazil, this is a private beach house covering an expansive 750 square meters. As an exclusive family retreat, the interior is closed to the public. A São Paulo-based architectural team executed a restrained and acute renovation of this existing modernist building. Rather than imposing new architectural symbols, they sharpened the building's lines, cleared spatial alignments, and added a generous protective canopy to the facade, allowing the residence to recede into the protected Atlantic Forest with unprecedented humility.

2. Lifestyle-Driven Ground Floor Reconfiguration: The most compelling trait of this residence lies in how its spatial programming is entirely subordinated to the authentic rhythms of its inhabitants. Because the clients are an avid foiling family, the architects thoroughly reconfigured the lower level into a dedicated zone playfully termed the "foil cave." This area not only properly houses various surfboards, wetsuits, and professional equipment but also seamlessly

integrates a home theater, office, and games room. This unpretentious design attitude, treating architecture as direct infrastructure for living, demonstrates a highly practical spatial aesthetic.

3. Natural Textures Blurring Indoor-Outdoor Boundaries:

Stepping into the upper-floor living spaces, a light and subtly nautical atmosphere immediately unfolds. Light woods, natural stone, and travertine interweave to establish a warm tone for the interior. The architects ingeniously placed a mirror above the dining sideboard, directly reflecting the lush forest landscape into the room and completely dissolving the building's physical boundaries. Through these restrained and precise orchestrations of materials, light, and shadow, the residence achieves a deep resonance with its natural surroundings.

Visit Recommendation

- **Best Approach:** It is highly recommended that you capture the micro-tectonic logic of this residence through architectural photography. Direct your visual focus to the "foil cave" on the lower level—which embodies both ruggedness and precision—and the

clever mirror design in the upper-floor living room reflecting the greenery of the Atlantic Forest. Observe how the architects elegantly translated an avid outdoor lifestyle into an interior spatial vocabulary.

- **Core Highlights:** Study the aesthetic of spatial restraint by Nati Minas & Studio. Observe how they discarded ostentatious self-expression, using "active listening" as their core design tool, thereby allowing the renovated old building to perfectly fit the living trajectories and spiritual aspirations of its occupants like a tailor-made garment.
- **Surrounding Academic Context Visit:** Since you are focusing on the coastal region of São Paulo State, Brazil, it is strongly advised that during a future visit to Guarujá, you not only enjoy this famous beach destination but also drive into the city of São Paulo. You can visit the São Paulo Museum of Art designed by Brazilian modernist master Lina Bo Bardi, experiencing the raw power and spirit of freedom suspended in mid-air characteristic of Brazilian contemporary architecture within a grand urban scale.

One-Sentence Summary: Using a restrained design language and warm natural materials, it precisely reshapes an old beach villa on the edge of the forest in Guarujá, Brazil, into a tranquil sanctuary serving a surfing family.
