

旅游探访指数 - NOT A HOTEL Setouchi

总分：4.5/5.0 (蜿蜒在濑户内海小岛上的丝带)

1. 私密性与可达性:

- 这是一处位于日本濑户内海鹭岛西南端的奢华度假别墅群，总占地达三万平方米。由于其作为顶尖度假酒店的专属属性，这里仅对预订的住客开放。远离喧嚣的离岛位置，赋予了它极高的私密性与避世感。

2. 呼应地形的夯土丝带:

- 丹麦知名建筑团队在处理这片山地时，没有选择粗暴地推平。三座别墅分别以其能看到的景观度数命名为“180”、“270”和“360”。它们如同优美的丝带般顺着山坡延展，外墙直接就地取材，采用了古老的夯土工艺，将大地的原始肌理完美地暴露在建筑表面。

3. 融合北欧与日式传统:

- 建筑师将斯堪的纳维亚的极简美学与日本传统建造智慧精妙融合。玻璃立面重新诠释了日式障子门，消融了室内外的界限；深色板岩地砖借鉴了榻榻米的铺设比例；而覆盖着低反射率太阳能瓦的屋顶，则用现代环保科技重塑了传统日式屋顶的经典意象。

探访指南

- **最佳方式:** 推荐你在落日时分, 预订位于山腰或山顶的房型。泡在如浮岛般的露天泳池里, 感受夯土墙面在夕阳下泛起的温暖色泽, 远眺壮阔的濑户内海全景。
- **看点:** 仔细观察承重墙体上层层叠叠的夯土纹理。体会设计团队是如何摒弃工业化材料, 用最原始的泥土和最前沿的零碳技术, 在这座偏远小岛上打造出兼具远古气息与当代奢华的居住空间的。
- **项目周边顺带探访推荐:** 既然你来到了濑户内海区域, 千万不要错过附近星罗棋布的艺术岛屿。强烈推荐搭乘渡轮前往直岛, 去朝圣地中美术馆以及那些散落在海边的波点南瓜雕塑。这与鹭岛上这座由夯土筑成的自然奢华酒店, 构成了一场完美的自然与艺术的岛屿巡礼。

一句话总结: 它用古老的夯土工艺和现代的零碳科技, 在濑户内海的离岛上织就了三条融入山海的自然丝带。

1. Privacy & Accessibility:

- Located on the southwestern cape of Sagishima Island

in the Seto Inland Sea, Japan, this is a luxury hospitality villa complex spanning 30,000 square meters. Due to its exclusive nature as a top-tier resort, it is only accessible to booked guests. Its remote island location endows it with an exceptional sense of privacy and escapism.

2. Terrain-Responsive Rammed Earth Ribbons:

- The renowned Danish architectural practice, BIG, chose not to flatten the mountainous terrain. The three villas—named 180, 270, and 360 to reflect their panoramic viewing angles—unfurl like graceful ribbons along the hillside. The exterior walls are constructed using ancient rammed earth techniques with soil excavated directly from the site, beautifully exposing the earth's raw geological strata on the building's surface.

3. Fusing Nordic and Japanese Traditions:

- The architects masterfully blended Scandinavian minimalist aesthetics with traditional Japanese building wisdom. The glass facades reinterpret traditional shoji screens, dissolving indoor-outdoor boundaries; the dark slate flooring draws inspiration from tatami mat layouts. Meanwhile, the low-reflective solar tile roofs use

modern eco-technology to reimagine the classic Japanese roof profile.

Visitor Guide

- **Best Way to Visit:** It is highly recommended to book a mid-slope or summit villa and enjoy the sunset. Soak in the open-air pool that feels like a floating island, experience the warm hues of the rammed earth walls under the setting sun, and gaze out at the sweeping panorama of the Seto Inland Sea.
- **Highlights:** Carefully observe the striated textures of the load-bearing rammed earth walls. Experience how the design team abandoned industrialized materials, using the most primitive soil alongside cutting-edge net-zero technologies to create a living space on this remote island that feels both ancient and contemporarily luxurious.
- **Recommended Nearby Visit:** Since you are in the Seto Inland Sea region, do not miss the surrounding art islands scattered across the water. It is highly recommended to take a ferry to Naoshima to embark on a pilgrimage to the Chichu Art Museum and the

famous polka-dot pumpkin sculptures by the sea. This forms a perfect island-hopping journey of nature and art, complementing the natural luxury of the rammed earth hotel on Sagishima.
